CIVIL ARREST WARRANT: MARK DeYOUNG

ISSUED: September 28, 2011

Based upon the following facts:

WHEREAS, on or about October 11, 2010, Mark DeYoung, in his capacity as ranking corporate officer of Alliant Techsystems (ATK), personally accepted from members of AlliantACTION a document entitled ***Employee Liabilities of Weapon Manufacturers Under International Law***.

WHEREAS, on or about July 11, 2011, ATK announced they have received a contract for the M829E4 120mm Advanced Kinetic Energy (AKE) tactical tank round for the U.S. Army.

WHEREAS, on or about August 2, 2011, at Alliant Techsystems annual shareholders meeting, President and CEO Mark DeYoung verified the M829E4 shell contained Depleted Uranium.

WHEREAS a resolution passed by the United Nations Commission on Human Rights in 1996 stated categorically that weapons containing depleted uranium are "weapons of mass or indiscriminate destruction" and "the production, sale and use of such weapons are incompatible with international human rights and humanitarian law".

WHEREAS, the Seventh Nuremberg principle states: ***Complicity in the commission of a crime against peace, a war crime, or a crime against humanity as set forth in Principle VI is a crime under international law.***

WHEREAS, as citizens, we are obligated and responsible to enforce all International Laws and Conventions to which the United States of America is signatory.
